PASTOR'S REPORT

At last year's AGM we spoke about the changes we were looking at making to our Church Constitution. In December we unanimously accepted the new Constitution which has already helped our Elders focus on pastoral ministry and our staff and volunteer Deacons to work together more effectively to manage the activities and resources of the church. A big contributor to that work was Albert O'Neill, who helped us to maintain the spirit and intent of our previous Constitution and adapt it to our current ministry context.

Another of my highlights of the last year has been the continued growth in ministry among men which I write about later in the reports. Two of the heroes of that work have been Wayne Beard and Leon Tenakov, whose personal testimonies of God's grace energised their love and service.

I have so many precious memories of these men, such as the joys of singing praises at conferences alongside Albert, bowing in prayer alongside Wayne and being alongside Leon at his baptism. There's so many more memories and stories to savour as I look back.

As I reflect on the impact these men have made on me personally and on the life of our church family I am very thankful to God for them; but I'm also grateful that He's raising up more men, women and children to take hold of the baton and run the next leg of the race.

Spurred on by the testimony of a great cloud of witnesses gone before, followers of Jesus are throwing off things that they got caught up in and the sins that so easily tripped us up; and we're running with perseverance the race He's marked out for us (Heb 12).

How's that going for you? My prayer is that these reports help us celebrate where it's happening and invite us to keep doing it. Throwing off hindrances & sins doesn't happen at the start line, it's a daily discipline! Perseverance wouldn't be needed if running the race was easy! But together we run. Our goal - like Jesus' - is the eternal joy that God has set before us.

CHAIR OF DEACONS' REPORT - BRAD RAYNOR



What are some highlights from the past year?

Successful review and acceptance of the KCC constitution. A new constitution provides the framework for the Elders and Management Team (MT) to have role clarity and get on with serving the church.

The effective and harmonious division of the "Board" into Elders and Deacons. The safe and open communication has provided the space for each team to get on and do their work.

The development of an effective Management Team structure. The trust all the Deacons have between each other. The open, honest and accountable conversations we have that results in work being undertaken and completed.

The really boring stuff has been excellent. Boring stuff like policy development and procedural development. Formation of reporting cycles and decision-making clarity have provided great foundation for collaborative work.

The meeting between the Chairs of the Elders & Deacons and Pastor Michael is very positive. It keeps open good communication lines and assists in action taking from both boards. Requests for new policies and direction are passed up, and operational input is sought from the Elders. The ability to plan together has resulted in swifter actions and outcomes.

The way safety has been embedded in all areas of the MT actions is reassuring from both a regulatory and statutory position. Many people don't get excited by good policy and procedure however the MT getting this into shape is protecting KCC and allowing us all to get on with our mission of Sharing and Declaring the Good News.

Where have you seen God at work?

I see it in the way the varied members of the MT have come together. Forming a new operational management team from scratch is complex however many of the issues that arise elsewhere have not troubled us. We are a diverse group of skilled people who work together at an executive level very well. The way everyone listens more than they speak and then ask critical thinking questions allows us to deal with sophisticated issues together. An example of this is when Daniel brought a list of items for maintenance to the board. He requested assistance in prioritising the items. After good conversation considering as areas, we were able to priorities items. However more importantly we as the MT identified the need for a more comprehensive maintenance and capital works plan. This then resulted in the submission for multiple grants for funding to assist with capital works. It also resulted in a collective decision to pursue whole church consultation about the building needs now and for the next 30 years. This will then be taken to an architect to create drawing of possible futures as well as developing a scope of works to guide maintenance and capital expenditure in a way where we the left hand knows what the right hand is doing. Ensuring we put our time and resources to meet immediate needs but not infringe on future works. This future looking planning is a result of good communication and collaboration started by Daniel and then expanded by the MT.

What are you looking forward to for next year?

The continued growth of the MT. The addition of a representative for Global Reach and Communities. Also, with Jess stepping into the Secretary role finding a replacement for her as Treasurer.

I personally am just looking forward to working with such good people to assist the Church to keep moving towards our mission.

SUNDAY SERVICES

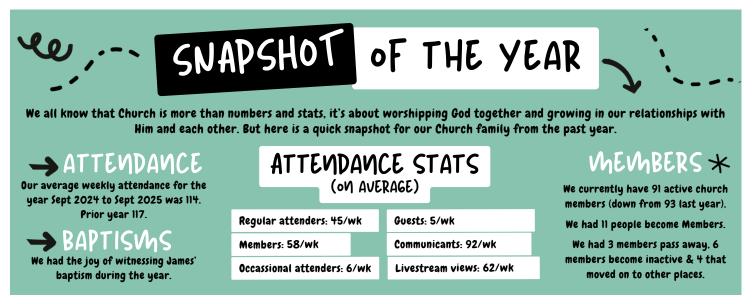
Over the past year we have seen some major positives in the gatherings ministry! Some big ones are:

What are some highlights from the past year?

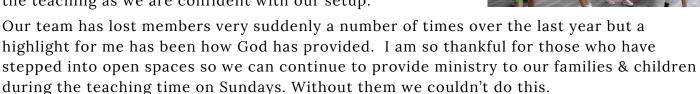
Family Services – it has been wonderful to continue to develop regular services where our younger children stay in with the church family for the whole service and we can share together.

COMMUNITIES CENTRED ON JESUS

In recent years we've talked about neighbourhood groups that bring people together based on where they live; and growth groups that bring people together for a particular purpose such as prayer, Bible study, discipleship, pastoral support and so on.

This year we have focussed less on developing neighbourhood groups so we can focus more on building a sense of connection across the whole church through things like church lunches. Thanks Julie for your amazing leadership and I'm looking forward to more creative lunchtimes on Sunday!

We used the "My One Thing" idea to encourage people to take one truth or action away from our Sunday gathering and talk to someone about it. If we don't talk about and do something with the truth God gives us, it's just like a seed left on a path that the birds come and snatch up! However if we share it with others and obey it, it binds us together and helps us become more like Jesus. We'll continue to encourage our church family to grow in how we do this together in our community life.

I'm excited that our Management Team is exploring significant works to our church family home. One of the key priorities is on how our home provides great spaces for people to connect and for every person to be included. This means thinking carefully about accessibility and safety for vulnerable people; thinking about how the inside and outside spaces communicate the good news of Jesus to people in our community & those who use our facility and so on.

We're also focussing on strengthening our men's and women's ministries, not in terms of having events but building strong relationships that drive what we do. For men, we've resumed our Bro Brekkies, developed more E4 groups and launched "The Forge". For women, we're currently building our core team and have some exciting plans for early next year to add to the wonderful work already happening in Konnect, KYB and Gospel Girls. I'd love to hear from women who are keen to be involved!

Wanneroo Neighbourhood Group - Emily Arthur

The Wanneroo Neighbour Group meet around 4 times a year, normally we enjoy a bring and share meal (pot luck) around a winter fire pit, a summer picnic or an indoor picnic when the weather is not so nice. The adults chat and cuddle our newest member of our group, baby AJ (who has already attended 2 nights), the kids play with toys or run around the backyard, trying to not wash their shoes in the pond, the dog is always close to the kids. This year, we have taken the opportunity to invite some people from outside of Wanneroo to a dinner. This has given us the opportunity to get to know different people within the church and to love and care for them.

Although the purpose of this group is not about spiritual growth, I think we could all say that we have all grown in friendship, that we would be happy to call on one of our neighbours in this group in a time of need and that actually we have grown spiritually from each other as we get to know each other over dinner and get to encourage each other and say hi at church.

Ladies' KYB (Know Your Bible) Group - Marian Hall

Over the past 12 months, 22 ladies have participated in the Ladies' KYB Bible Study group. We meet fortnightly on Tuesday mornings, in the church building, with 20 ladies currently in the group and an average attendance of about 16.

In the second half of 2024 we completed a series on Old Testament Prayers. This year we have studied the book of Romans and we are currently studying 1 Samuel. The KYB (Know Your Bible) method has a study book for each lady and



we all prepare for the study by answering the set questions and we share our findings.

There is often some lively discussion and we have all grown in our knowledge of the Bible. All studies have been interesting, encouraging us and challenging us. And a major part of our fellowship is our prayerful support for each other and for the rest of our church congregation.

We have additional times of fellowship over coffee when there is a fifth Tuesday in a month (which occurs 3 or 4 times a year). In April we went to the Shalom House coffee shop and heard a testimony from one of the ladies whose life has been turned around as she found Jesus as Saviour and freedom from drug addiction through Shalom House.

We take a special interest in Sam & Penny, praying for them regularly and giving offerings to them, above our regular support. We have brought news from them to the congregation. There is always room for ladies to join the group. Just see me or Verna Pilton.

E4 Men's Groups - Mike Birch

E4 groups provide men with the opportunity to open up with other men about how they're going and what's happening in their lives. We pray for each other & those closest to us and share godly wisdom & encouragement. E4 points us to Ecclesiastes 4 & Ephesians 4, two passages that speak of the value of being there for each other & speaking truth in love to each other.

This year I've continued to meet fortnightly on Tuesdays with Blair, Graham, Garth & Wayne and on Wednesdays with Jaymen, Luca, Phil and Steve. Ethan & James have also started meeting with me during the day on Monday. Several of these men have also begun discipling others 1-1 or in small group/team settings.

Because we give time for the guys to share about what's going on in life E4 groups tend to work best for groups of 3 to 6 & this can make it tricky to include more people. Quite a few other men were interested in getting a group going but it's been a challenge to get them together at the same time to build connection as a group. Our Tuesday & Wednesday groups are going to trial a new format called "The Forge" that we hope will lead to more men discipling men – stay tuned!

Monday Morning Prayer Group - Marian Hall

After a message from visiting speaker Carl Carmody who spoke about the vital importance of prayer for your local church, I approached 2 other ladies who strongly agreed with me that we needed this at Kingsley.

We agreed to meet weekly, on Mondays at 1 pm. We asked if we could meet in the church building and threw it open for all who could to join us. We have been meeting for 1 hour of prayer for several months now.

Obviously, Monday afternoon does not suit those who work during the day, but it suited us, and probably a lot of other Kingsley members. Others might like to start an evening prayer meeting as well!

Karl Carmody had said that church congregations who pray regularly grow spiritually and

numerically, usually in proportion to the number of members who come together for prayer.

We usually have about 6 attending, with about 10 or 12 different people having come along at least once. We pray for our local congregation, leaders, activity groups, individuals who have asked for prayer, community, Global Outreach, our nation and national leaders and our world. We always start with praise and worship prayers and then have conversational prayer with our Heavenly Father, covering a huge range of topics.

Changing Lanes, Crossing Cultures - Mike Birch

Changing Lanes, Crossing Cultures is a 6 session course to help followers of Jesus to think carefully about our own culture and the cultures around us that God calls us to reach out to in His name. It's been hugely encouraging to chat through the content of the course with 12 people who are participating under the leadership of Dushan Jeyabalan from Interserve.

Growing in our awareness of culture not only helps us to not conform to the pattern of this world as God instructs us; but also gives us greater wisdom in learning how to love each other as members of one family where there is neither "Jew nor Gentile" (to use the 1st century context). It's hard to love each other when we don't understand each other! Finally, it helps us to think as missionaries to the people around us so we can Share and Declare the Love of God in our Communities - not just with people who we are most similar to!

We're halfway through the course and you'll start to see some practical application over coming months as we encourage each other personally and work together as a team to grow the community building and evangelistic efforts of our church family.

The Bible Recap - Jess Baum

The Bible Recap with Tara-Leigh Cobble is a plan to chronologically read through the Bible in a year. Last year we had a group of 26 using the plan & getting together on occassion to share how we were finding the journey of reading through the Bible.

We found The Bible Recap was really easy to use, with set readings and a recap video each day. The Recap video is really helpful, especially when you finish your reading and think 'what have I just read?'. Tara-Leigh provides context around the passage and summarises the main points, but the best bit is that she encourages you to see where God is in the passage in the form of a 'God Shot' and she shares her God Shot too, always ending in her catch phrase 'He's where the Joy is!'

This year, the whole church was invited to join in with reading the Bible using the Bible Recap Plan. We have 43 people currently working their way through the plan and we are closing in on the end of the Old Testament & looking forward to the start of the New Testament on October 1. Anyone is welcome to join in going forward. The New Testament is a great time to jump in!

We have also begun 2 Bible Recap groups who meet regularly to recap the recap and share our struggles and learnings from the Bible. These groups meeting fortnightly, one on a Monday night and the other on a Sunday afternoon. If you would be interested in joining a group, please come and have a chat with me.

One of the things we love most about the plan is that there is no guilt if you fall behind or stop at certain points. As Tara-Leigh shares, wherever you are in the plan, God is sovereign, and you are where you are meant to be. Amongst the group, we've heard so many stories of people feeling personal guilt because they were behind, but then the day's reading that they were up to, was exactly what they needed to hear from God that day.

The Mental Health Discipleship Group - Suzanne Thomas

The Living Grace Course

The Living Grace course is a whole-health, whole-person, Christ-centered and evidence-based mental health resource for mental wellness and wellbeing. The course has been devised by the Mental Health Grace Alliance. Each session explores relevant topics and tools related to mental health and how to improve mental wellbeing. The course does not in any way replace professional mental health treatment or therapy but simply seeks to provide mental health discipleship, integrating Christ-centered biblical truth with relevant mental health tools to those experiencing and facing mental health challenges. The small group discipleship experience provides a supportive community which focuses on blending both science and Scripture to foster meaningful change and growth. Research tells us that in the previous 12 months an estimated 1 in 5 Australians experienced a mental health disorder, and the Church has an important and significant role to play in not only 'seeing' these individuals but journeying alongside them with God's love, grace and compassion.

The Living grace group provides a safe, non-judgmental and supportive space for people living with mental health challenges to share their often difficult and painful stories and to encourage one another in their Christian faith. It's knowing that there are others within the Kingsley Church family who have also experienced and are living with mental health difficulties and disorders and who 'get it' and understand. Through fellowship and discussion, it has been learning to trust in God's sovereignty, love and grace. It's knowing that God's plans and purposes for our lives can never be derailed by our circumstances and that He can and does use our struggles and suffering for His glory.

Please pray for a previous Living Grace group participant or a person who is passionate about mental health discipleship to facilitate a Living Grace group during the day for those for whom a daytime Living Grace group would be more convenient. Next year I am hoping to facilitate a Family Grace group on a Thursday evening to provide mental health discipleship for family/friends of a loved one living with a mental health challenge. The Family Grace course doesn't replace professional carer support or counselling but focuses on blending science and Scripture and providing encouragement and helpful tools for supporting a loved one's mental wellness and strengthening relationships.

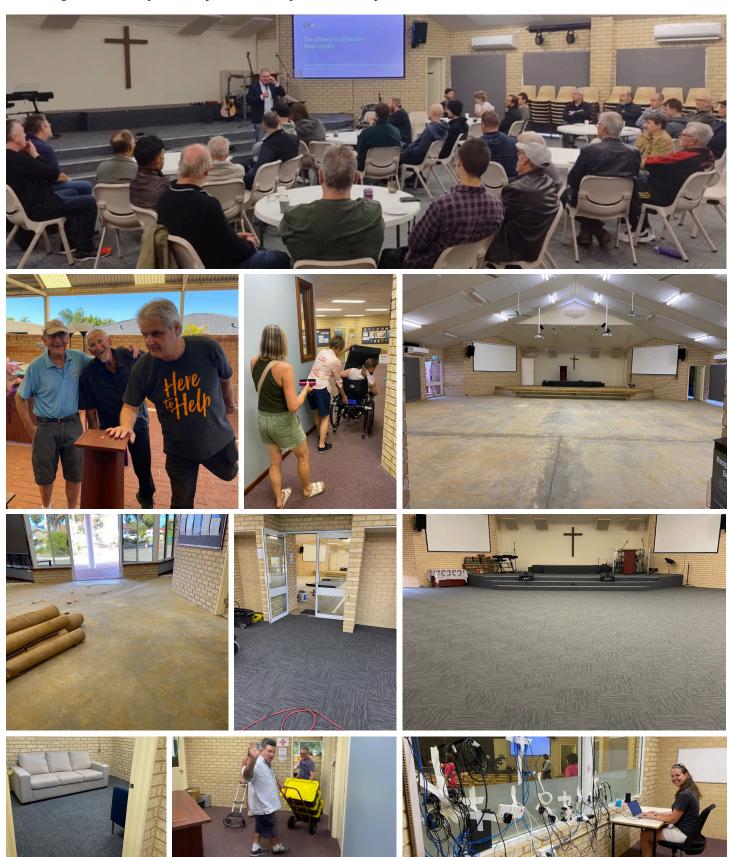

HEALTH & SAFETY

Over the past year, we strengthened our safety foundations and our readiness to respond well if something goes wrong. We trained and appointed Emergency Wardens. Please take a moment to familiarise yourself with who to contact during an incident via the posters with names and photos, and we have refreshed our Emergency Plan and Evacuation Procedures.

Day to day, we continued task-based risk assessments and now maintain a Risk Register to track and treat key risks. Reporting has improved, too: a great example was the prompt closure of the playground when hazards were identified, followed by quick volunteer support that enabled an earlier-than-planned reopening, thank you!

Our WHS Committee met regularly, and the Safety Newsletter continued to share practical tips. In October, for National Safe Work Month, our leadership team will follow Safe Work Australia's four-week risk-management process to strengthen how we manage risks and close any gaps. Please keep praying for our safety and risk work so we can keep our church a safe, welcoming place for everyone.

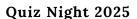

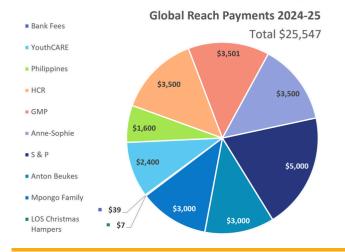
Sumba Partnership Visit

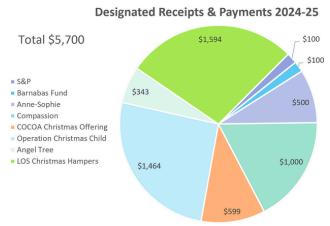

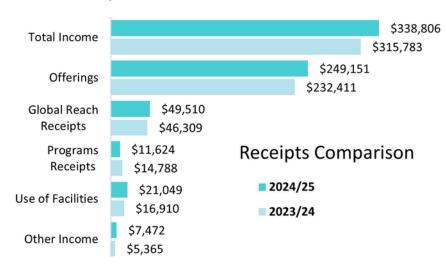

TREASURER'S REPORT

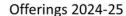
Below is a snapshot of the faithful and generous giving by our Church Family and how the funds have been used.

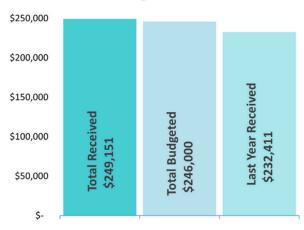
- Offerings increased by \$16,740 (7.2%) from the prior year. Last year decrease was \$10,855.
- Total offerings for 2024/25 were \$249,151 & budgeted offerings were \$246,000. We exceeded our offerings budget by \$3,151.
- \$49,510 was given toward our Global Reach.
- Our net financial position for the year was a surplus of \$7,814, not including the book adjustment for depreciation & GST on Minister's Working Account expenses & an overall deficit for Global Reach of \$7,159.
- Our cash position remained healthy for the 2024/25 financial year.

2025 Offerings compared to budgeted offerings and prior year actuals.





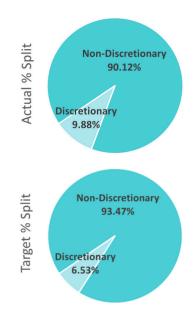
We were able to provide:

- well-kept facilities for ministry activities
- pastoral staff for teaching and equipping
- administration staff to assist in the running of the church activities.

EXPENDITURE SUMMARY

- Total church operating expenditure increased by \$5,398 from last year.
- Wages increased by \$12,125 from the prior year, as a result of more staff being employed than in the prior year.
- Expenditure on equipment, furniture, repairs & technology decreased by \$15,570 from last year.
- Cleaning & rubbish removal expenditure decreased by \$3,783 as the church hired an internal cleaner instead of a cleaning contractor.
- IT expenditure increased by \$6,304 as we entered into a Service Agreement with an external IT consultant.
- \$5,054 was spent on reviewing & updating our Constitution during the year.
- Expenditure on Visiting Speakers decreased by \$894 from the prior year.
- Hire Purchase charges from the Solar Panels agreement decreased by \$661 as the agreement was paid out last year,
- Special Designated Offerings increased by \$2,410 from last year.
- Our discretionary expenditure was over our target for the year as we were able to spend offerings received in excess of our budget to upgrade computers for staff (due to Windows 10 support ending) \$4,475 & we also had to tend to the tree dropping limbs in the church carpark \$2,400. The Special Designated Offerings also fall under Discretionary Expenditure.

88.99%of offerings were made online in 2025.

In preparing the budget for the 2025/26 Financial Year, the Deacons have adjusted their budgeting format to align with the ministry areas represented on the Management Team. Each Deacon is then able to manage their individual ministry budgets for the financial year.

To cover the level of expenditure budgeted for the 2025/26 year, our monthly offerings for the 2025/26 year will need to be \$20,000. Any offerings received over this amount will help towards expending the ministry work of the Church and in updating our facilities.

We believe that the set budget will help provide the resources for the church to carry out its mission and we pray that God will use each of us to do His work here in Kingsley.

There are also several capital upgrades and repairs needed for our building in the coming year and these will be mainly funded from our cash reserves.

PASTORS ADDRESS

Paul thanked Jess for her efforts as Treasurer with those in attendance joining in a round of applause

Paul spoke about the due diligence from Jess on the Board and how Vern Meiring, who is a specialist in the business world, had expressed confidence in what we are doing that is not found in many multimillion-dollar companies.

Paul spoke about how our Global Reach offerings had increased and our weekly offering had decreased in the 2023/24 financial year.

Paul encouraged the members how Global Reach is an above and beyond offering. Paul asked the members to consider how we can meet our budgeted commitments if we don't meet the budget. Please pray for this and act if lead was the request.
